#### Dear Prospective Candidate,

Thank you for your interest in the Managing Director position at AguaClara Reach. We're honored that you're considering joining us at a pivotal moment in our journey to expand access to safe drinking water on tap.

According to the WHO & UNICEF, 1 in 3 people globally still lack access to safe drinking water, and recent research from <u>Science</u> estimates that nearly 4 billion people experience water insecurity. These staggering numbers underscore the urgency of our mission and the opportunity before us. AguaClara Reach brings a bold new approach to drinking water treatment: open-source, gravity-powered, and designed specifically for small communities that are often left behind by conventional infrastructure.

We are a small nonprofit with a big vision. Our work is rooted in creating and sharing better technologies so that communities can have safe water on tap, not just today, but year after year. What sets us apart is not only our innovative technology, but our innovative process: we co-create solutions with communities, implementation partners, and researchers. Our systems are designed to be operated and maintained locally, and our open-source model ensures that knowledge and impact are shared freely.

I've been involved with AguaClara for over a decade, starting as a student researcher at Cornell University, where I eventually became Team Lead for the 100-person AguaClara research team focused on drinking water and wastewater treatment. I joined the Board of Directors in 2019 as Secretary and have served as Board President since 2021. I've stayed with this work because I believe in its power, not just the technology, but the community behind it. AguaClara Reach is full of inspiring people who are deeply committed to equity, sustainability, and innovation.

In recent years, we've expanded our geographic footprint, launched new programs, and diversified our funding sources. We're currently growing our work in Puerto Rico and strengthening partnerships across Latin America, the Caribbean, and the U.S. As the only organization developing





open-source, gravity-powered treatment systems for small communities, we're addressing a critical gap in the global water sector—and we're ready for the next scale-up stage.

As we prepare for this exciting transition, we're looking for a leader who shares our growth mindset and is grounded in our core values: love, integrity, equity, learning, and innovation. These values guide everything we do, from how we design our systems to how we build relationships and measure success.

To our staff, board, partners, and volunteers—thank you for making this work possible. And to you, candidate, thank you for considering joining us. We can't wait to learn more about you.

### **About AguaClara Reach**

AguaClara Reach (ACR) is a growing 501(c)(3) nonprofit that is dedicated to creating and sharing better technologies so that communities can have safe water on tap.

#### Mission

AguaClara Reach advances global access to safe drinking water through design and innovation of community-scale, gravity-powered water treatment technologies, capacity building with local implementation partners, and research and education with university partners.

#### History

The initial AguaClara technologies were developed at Cornell University by a student-based research program in 2005. The goal of the program was to design drinking water treatment plants that would last for decades in resource-limited communities and provide open-source access to their research and technological advancements. AguaClara technology is now in operation at 26 water treatment plants, serving over 105,000 people in Central America and India. In 2017, AguaClara Reach was established to expand on the previous successes of the AguaClara program, as a nonprofit organization. AguaClara Reach now leads the development and implementation of AguaClara technologies, with the continued mission of bringing safe drinking water on tap to communities around the world. With a gross revenue of \$225,000 in 2024, and a grant of \$1.5m over the next 3 years, the organization is at a critical inflection point in its growth.

AguaClara Reach's programs include:

- Research Programs: AguaClara Reach collaborates with their partner research
  organizations at Cornell University, New Jersey Institute of Technology, and Ohio State
  University to accelerate innovation. This research guides many of their technological
  innovations as well as fosters a meaningful academic opportunity for students.
- Innovation Programs: Their programs also include ongoing development with their innovation and implementation partner in Honduras, Agua Para el Pueblo. This makes it possible for them to introduce new technologies.
- Implementation Programs: In partnership with Agua Para el Pueblo, ACR implements their technology throughout the world in collaboration with other implementing and funding partners. This is where they implement projects that bring communities access to safe water.
